## FS-ISAC GDPR Compliance Statement

FS-ISAC welcomes the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Data protection is important to FS-ISAC and its members and we are taking the GDPR requirements very seriously. To ensure that our privacy standards provide appropriate protection, FS-ISAC has created this GDPR Compliance Statement to help explain our approach to implementing our new GDPR compliance program.

### What is GDPR and Why is it Relevant?

GDPR is a new European Union (EU) regulation that imposes more stringent requirements on companies that collect, store or process personal data of EU residents. Any company that holds personal data of EU residents is accountable under GDPR, regardless of the company's physical location. The definition of "personal data" is broad and effectively covers any information that may identify an individual. GDPR is effective as of 25 May 2018 and FS-ISAC has been preparing to have its GDPR compliance program in place by that date.

### IC3 Issues Internet Crime Report for 2017

On 7 May 2018 the FBI released the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) 2017 Internet Crime Report. Hot topics for 2017 include the following: Business Email Compromise, Ransomware, Tech Support Fraud, Elder Justice Initiative and Extortion. The report provides 2017 Overall Statistics and provides list of 2017 victims by age group, top foreign countries, top 10 (US) states by number of victims, top 10 (US) states by victim loss, overall states statistics, as well as a breakdown 2017 crime types. ### Android Security Bulletin—June 2018

Google released their monthly security update on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018. A total of 57 vulnerabilities were patched, 11 rated as “critical” and 46 were rated as “high”. Products included in the updates includes the Android operating system and kernel as well as components of LG, MediaTek, NVIDIA, and Qualcomm.

Google [said](#) the most severe of the vulnerabilities are remote code execution bugs (CVE-2018-9341, CVE-2018-5146 and CVE-2017-13230) in the Android media framework “that could enable a remote attacker using a specially crafted file to execute arbitrary code within the context of a privileged process.”
